A brief background of the artist:

Andy Warhol was born in Pittsburgh, Pa. He was sickly as a child and spent much time at home reading movie magazines and tabloids. This could have been an influence on his choice of images as a professional artist. His artistic talent was noticed as a child by his art teachers. He attended the Saturday art classes for children at the Carnegie Museum of Art. Andy earned his college degree in commercial art and graphic design from Carnegie Mellon University, then Carnegie Institute of Technology. In search of a career as a commercial artist, he moved to New York City. He had a very lucrative career creating advertisements for many companies. He eventually began his painting career developing his unique style. Andy Warhol's art was very influential in the direction that art took during the 1960s and 1970s.

The Andy Warhol Museum in Pittsburgh features the many different aspects of Andy Warhol's career.
